Survey of Student Interest in a Master's Program at GSAPP
The Graduate School of Applied and Professional Psychology is creating a
Master of Applied Psychology (MAP) Program to prepare students to
successfully pursue doctoral programs in psychology and to offer training
in selected psychology related careers through specific concentrations—for
example, Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA), and Alcohol and Drug Counseling.
Upon graduation, it would also provide career opportunities in ABA
Programs (e.g. Behavior Specialists in the schools) or as Certified
Alcohol and Drug Counselors (CADC).

In addition, this program could potentially serve as the 4th and 5th year of a five-year combined BA/MS degree for Rutgers undergraduates. By staying an extra year and pursuing this program, a student would graduate with a master's degree.

Although this master's program can lead to employment (e.g. with ABA or CADC certification), this is not an accredited clinical program and is not designed to lead to licensure for the private practice of psychology. Students seeking this licensure must continue their education by applying to doctoral programs in psychology. One aim of the program is to provide excellent preparation for doctoral work.
