With respect to the actual text, either the hardbound or the ebook is fine. Previous text editions are OK as well. **THE BOOK IS NOT REQUIRED, BUT RECOMMENDED.**

Course pre-requisite: PSYC 101 (General Psychology) or its equivalent

Course requirements: Three hourly examinations (50 items each) and a comprehensive final exam (100 questions). ***You MUST take all 3 hourly exams and the final.*** The lowest of the 3 hourly exam scores will be dropped. **No makeup exams will be permitted unless** (1) I have been notified in advance of your reason by email or phone **and** (2) documentation (i.e., a note from an M.D. or confirmation of death in the family) is provided. Make-up examinations may be in written answer format. Special provisions can be made to take exams early (e.g., due to *documented* multiple exam conflicts, NCAA travel, etc.). **NOTE: If remote instruction is in effect, exams will be administered via the course Sakai site per the attached class calendar. They will be available ONLY during the designated lecture period 2:50 – 4:10 PM.**

Attendance is not mandatory, but is *highly recommended*, since many exam questions will be derived from lecture material not covered in the text. **NOTE: If remote instruction is in effect, lecture slides will be available on the Sakai site (in the Resources folder). Video/Audio of the lectures will be in the Media Gallery on the course Sakai site. I strongly suggest that you view these recorded lectures in sync with the actual schedule (i.e. each Monday and Wednesday) or on a timetable very close to that. That is the most effective way to master and remember new material – the research findings on learning and memory demonstrate that quite unequivocally.**

ADDL NOTE:

With remote instruction, the lectures (PowerPoint slides and accompanying video/audio files) will be available for extended time periods on the course Sakai site. However, you should try to view them one-at-a-time, with spacing and text reviewing between per the class calendar on the course Sakai site. Trying to master the content of multiple lectures in one sitting is a prescription for failure. PLEASE DON'T DO IT. IF YOU ARE USING THE BOOK, READ THE CORRESPONDING TEXT CHAPTER (see class calendar on Sakai site) BEFORE OR SOON AFTER VIEWING EACH LECTURE.

Your **total points** scored on your **2 best hourly exams** (2 pts. for each correct answer) and **the final** (1 pt. for each correct answer) will determine your course grade in accordance with the following schedule:
