

Diversity of Applicants

The Rutgers University PhD Psychology program seeks a diverse applicant pool. HOW DO I APPLY?

Where

 Applications are submitted on-line to the Rutger's School of Graduate Studies

Required Application Materials:

- Undergraduate transcripts
- Graduate transcripts, for applicants with prior graduate work
- GRE scores (verbal, quantitative, and writing. The psychology subject test is not required.)
- TOEFL scores for applicants with a native language other than English
- Personal statement describing research interests. It is essential to include the names of faculty members with whom the applicant would like to work.
- Three letters of recommendation

- Applications for admission in September are due **December 15** of the previous year. In some cases, late applications can be considered.

The Rutgers School of Graduate Studies is pleased to offer annual Diversity Fellowships to talented incoming students from a wide variety of backgrounds. These fellowships are designed to help Rutgers recruit and retain excellent graduate students from underrepresented groups.

Award: \$25,000 stipend for the first year, tuition remission, and health insurance

Eligibility: First-year Ph.D. applicants are eligible for nomination

Application Process:

- Nominations must be submitted by Graduate Program Directors only between January and February of each year
- Faculty Evaluators drawn from the humanities, social sciences, and STEM fields review a subset of candidates in their respective areas and make their recommendations to the Graduate School's Selection Committee.
- The Selection Committee aggregates the faculty recommendations and determines the overall rankings for the entire applicant pool.
